From Father:

Today we begin the most sacred and powerful week of the Church year—Holy Week. Palm Sunday, with its striking contrast of joy and sorrow, sets the stage. We begin by waving palms and crying out, "Hosanna to the Son of David!" Yet before the liturgy ends, we are crying, "Crucify Him!" In a single Mass, we move from glory to agony, from the gates of Jerusalem to the hill of Calvary.

It's easy to wonder how the same crowds who praised Jesus on Sunday could call for His death by Friday. But if we're honest, that same tension exists in our own hearts. We love the idea of Christ as King—but we often resist Him when He asks us to carry the cross. We want a Savior, but sometimes we struggle to surrender to the path of suffering, sacrifice, and self-emptying love. Palm Sunday holds up a mirror to the human soul—and invites us not to run from this tension, but to enter it.

This week, Jesus walks into suffering with open eyes and a willing heart. He is not swept up by events; He embraces them. He freely chooses the cross, not because He is forced, but because He loves. Holy Week is not just a remembrance of long-ago events. It is a living invitation. Jesus is asking each of us: Will you walk with Me?

This is the week that changed the world. It still has the power to change our lives. But it requires something of us. It asks us to show up—to pray, to enter into the liturgies, to let the rhythm of the Passion story touch our hearts in a new way. I know we are busy. I know there are demands on your time. But I want to encourage you: make this week different. Come to the Sacred Triduum—Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil. These are not just beautiful traditions. They are encounters with the Paschal Mystery, the very heart of our faith.

On Holy Thursday, we remember the Lord's Supper, the washing of feet, and the gift of the Eucharist. On Good Friday, we stand at the foot of the Cross, not as spectators, but as beloved sons and daughters for whom He died. And on Holy Saturday night, we enter into the darkness of the tomb and witness the light of the Resurrection blaze forth.

Let this be a holy week in your home, too. Take time for quiet prayer. Read the Passion in your Bible. Speak with your family about what Christ has done for us. Come to confession if it's been a while. Let this be a week not just of religious observance, but of spiritual renewal.

Today, we hold palms in our hands. By week's end, we will behold the wood of the Cross. And yet, it is through that wood that salvation comes. In Christ's death, we find life.

May this Holy Week draw us closer to Jesus, who entered into our suffering so that we might enter into His glory.

EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE

1. I AM THE LORD YOUR GOD. YOU SHALL NOT HAVE STRANGE GODS BEFORE ME.

Have I been involved in witchcraft, superstition or black magic?
Have I received Communion in a state of mortal sin?
Have I deliberately told a lie in Confession or withheld a mortal sin in Confession?

2. YOU SHALL NOT TAKE THE NAME OF THE LORD YOUR GOD IN VAIN.

Did I curse or swear? Did I use God's name in vain, lightly, carelessly, by blasphemy?
Have I wished evil upon another person?
Have I been angry with God and stayed in that state of anger?
Have I insulted a sacred person or abused a sacred object?

3. REMEMBER TO KEEP HOLY THE LORD'S DAY.

Have I deliberately missed Mass on Sundays or Holy Days of obligation?
Have I tried to observe Sunday as a family day and a day of rest?
Do I get enough rest or am I constantly running?
Do I do needless work on Sunday?

4. HONOR YOUR FATHER AND YOUR MOTHER.

Do I honor and obey my parents? Am I disrespectful towards them?
Have I neglected my duties to my spouse and children?
Have I given my family good religious example and try to bring peace into the home?
Do I care for my aged and infirmed relatives?

5. YOU SHALL NOT KILL.

Have I had an abortion or encouraged anyone to have an abortion?
Have I mutilated myself through any form of sterilization, etc.?
Have I harbored anger or resentment or hatred in my heart?
Have I physically harmed anyone? Have I driven recklessly (too fast, showing off, etc.)?
Have I abused alcohol or drugs?
Have I hurt myself through cutting, scratching, or in any other way?

6. YOU SHALL NOT COMMIT ADULTERY.

Have I been faithful to my marriage vows in thought and action?
Have I engaged in any sexual activity outside of marriage (intercourse, oral sex, inappropriate touching, mutual masturbation)?
Has each sexual act in my marriage been open to the transmission of new life?
Have I been guilty of masturbation? Have I entertained lustful thoughts?
Have I been guilty of any homosexual activity?
Do I seek to be chaste in my thoughts, words, and actions?
Was I "immodest" in the way I dressed, acted or spoke (leading others to arousal)?
Are my words, texts and photos on Facebook and/or other social media sites sexually charged?
Did I look at pornography or visit chat rooms that were inappropriate?

7. YOU SHALL NOT STEAL.

Have I stolen what is not mine?
Have I returned or made restitution for what I have stolen?
Did I waste time at work (which is really stealing from the company)?
Do I gamble excessively, thereby denying my family of their needs?
Do I seek to share what I have with the poor?

8. YOU SHALL NOT BEAR FALSE WITNESS AGAINST YOUR NEIGHBOR.

Have I lied? Have I gossiped? Have I spoken behind someone else's back?
Do I always tell the truth? Did I reveal secrets that should have been kept confidential?
Am I sincere in my dealings with others?
Am I critical, negative, or uncharitable in my thoughts of others?
Is what I write in my emails, IMs, text messages or on any social media sites true about myself or others?

9. YOU SHALL NOT DESIRE YOUR NEIGHBOR'S WIFE.

Have I caused impure thoughts by impure reading, movies, conversations or curiosity?
Do I pray at once to banish impure thoughts and temptations?

10. YOU SHALL NOT DESIRE YOUR NEIGHBOR'S GOODS.

Am I jealous of what other people have?
Do I envy the families or possessions of others?
Am I greedy or selfish?
Are material possessions the purpose of my life?



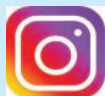

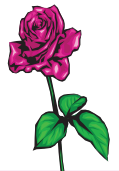
