From Father:

Singing the Mass in Lent: Kyrie, Sanctus & Agnus Dei

This Lent, you'll notice something a little different at Mass: we will sing several of the Church's most familiar "Ordinary" parts—the Kyrie eleison (Lord have Mercy), the Sanctus (Holy, Holy, Holy), and the Agnus Dei (Lamb of God)—using the Church's traditional chant settings.

I know that for some of us this will feel unfamiliar at first. Anything new can. But what we're doing is not about novelty. It's about returning to our roots, and allowing Lent to simplify our worship so that we can pray the Mass with greater recollection and depth.

Why Latin?

Latin is not a "secret language," nor is it meant to put anyone at a distance. Latin is simply the historic language of the Roman (Latin) Rite—our spiritual home within the Catholic Church. For centuries, Catholics across nations and cultures have prayed these same texts in the same language. Even today, Latin remains a sign of the Church's unity across the world and continuity across time.

When we sing Sanctus and Agnus Dei in Latin, we are reminded that the Mass does not belong to any one parish, era, or personality. The Mass belongs to Christ and His Church. Latin helps us feel that: we are part of something bigger than ourselves—something received, cherished, and handed on.

And don't worry: we are not "losing" meaning. In fact, using Latin often makes us listen more carefully, and pray more intentionally, because we are not on autopilot. The Church also provides clear translations, and over time these short texts become wonderfully familiar.

Also, this Lent we will also sing the Kyrie eleison in Greek. That may surprise some people, but it is actually one of the oldest surviving elements of the Mass. Kyrie eleison means "Lord, have mercy." From the earliest days of the Church, Christians used this prayer as a simple, urgent cry for God's mercy. Keeping it in Greek reminds us that our faith is rooted in the apostolic Church and the worship of the early Christians—long before modern languages or national borders shaped the world we know.

Why chant?

Chant is not performance music. Chant is sung prayer.

The Church has long held Gregorian chant as music especially fitting for the Roman liturgy—not because it is fancy, but because it is ordered to prayer. Chant doesn't rush. It doesn't draw attention to itself. It allows the sacred text to lead, and it creates a reverent atmosphere that supports silence, repentance, and awe—especially appropriate for Lent.

Chant tones can feel different at first because they are not driven by a strong beat like much modern music. Chant follows the natural rhythm of the words. It invites us to listen, breathe, and sing together as one body. In a noisy world, chant gently teaches the heart how to be still.

What do these prayers mean?

The Kyrie eleison (Lord, have mercy. Christ, have mercy. Lord, have mercy.) is our humble cry at the beginning of Mass. It sets a Lenten tone immediately: we come before God as we truly are—needing mercy, ready for conversion, and trusting in His compassion.

The Sanctus comes straight from Scripture. It echoes the angels' worship in Isaiah—"Holy, holy, holy..."—and the heavenly liturgy described in Revelation. At the Sanctus, we are joining the worship of heaven as the Eucharistic Prayer reaches its most sacred moment.

The Agnus Dei ("Lamb of God") draws from the words of St. John the Baptist: "Behold the Lamb of God." We sing it as we prepare for Holy Communion. It forms us in humility and trust: have mercy on us... grant us peace. It teaches us how to approach the Eucharist—aware of our need, confident in His mercy. A word of encouragement

If this is difficult at first, that's okay. Learning something sacred is worth the effort. I ask you to sing gently, listen carefully, and be patient—with yourself and with one another. As these chants become familiar, they will begin to feel like an old path you didn't know you missed.

My hope is simple: that this Lent, these Latin chants will help root us more deeply in who we are as Latin Rite Catholics—a people formed by a liturgy that is ancient, beautiful, and ever new, because it is always Christ who meets us there.
