From Father:

On Easter Sunday, the Church proclaims with great joy the heart of our faith: Jesus Christ, who was crucified and buried, has risen from the dead. This is not just a beautiful story or a symbol of hope. The Resurrection is a real event, and it changes everything.

Saint Paul says, "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is vain" (1 Cor. 15:17). The Resurrection is the foundation of Christianity. Jesus did not simply teach us how to live; He conquered sin and death. The tomb is empty. Death does not have the final word. Christ does.

That is why Easter is the greatest feast of the Church year. On Good Friday, we saw the depth of God's love poured out on the Cross. On Easter Sunday, we see that love victorious. The Father has raised His Son in glory, and the Risen Christ now lives forever.

What does this mean for us? First, it means that hope is real. We all carry burdens: grief, illness, anxiety, struggles in our families, or the weight of our sins. Easter does not ignore those realities. Instead, it proclaims that they are not the end of the story. The Resurrection shows us that God can bring life out of death, light out of darkness, and hope out of sorrow.

Second, the Resurrection means that eternal life is open to us. Jesus rose not only for Himself, but for us. In Baptism, we were united to His death and Resurrection. That means Easter is not just something we celebrate once a year. It is a mystery we are meant to live. We are called to die to sin and rise with Christ to a new way of life.

Finally, the Resurrection gives meaning even to the ordinary struggles of Christian life. Every prayer, every sacrifice, every act of charity, every effort to remain faithful matters. Because Christ is risen, none of it is in vain. His victory is already at work in us.

Easter is also a feast of joy. Not a shallow happiness, but the deep joy that comes from knowing that Jesus is alive. The Risen Lord meets us in His Word, in the Eucharist, and in the life of the Church. He comes to us and says, "Do not be afraid."

This Easter, let us ask for the grace to live as people of the Resurrection. Let us bring to the Lord whatever feels burdened, wounded, or entombed within us. He who rose from the dead can roll away every stone.

May the joy and hope of the Risen Christ fill your hearts and homes this Easter season.

Baptism
Baptisms are celebrated after the 10 a.m. Mass on Sundays upon request. Both first-time parents need to attend a Pre-Jordan class, which is held the first Wednesday of every month. Pre-Registration for the class is required by contacting the Parish Office. Sponsors not from Epiphany are required to submit a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish two weeks prior to the Baptism.
