My dear friends,

In this Sunday's gospel, we hear Jesus continue to provide his disciples with instruction in his Sermon on the Mount. The Lord Jesus frames his teachings in this way: "Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets. I have come not to abolish but to fulfill."

The Laws and Commandments given to Moses by God helped to guide our Jewish ancestors for centuries. With the coming of Jesus, the Lord then shares with us what was God's original intention from the beginning. Jesus is fulfilling what was first laid out centuries ago.

Jesus reveals the true depth of each ethical and moral teaching. Jesus reflects the heart of God the Father to us. It is not enough simply to keep the commandment at its face value. For instance, it is not enough simply to refrain from murder—but we must even refrain from anger itself. And it's not enough to just avoid the act of adultery—but we must rid ourselves of every lustful and impure thought.

Our Lord is always calling us to something more, to our deepest potential... to reflect the very heart of God the Father as has been revealed to us by His Son, Jesus Christ.

As we draw close to the season of Lent, consider how the Lord might be inviting you to do more than just the bare minimum. What if we entered into Lent seeking to fulfill the deepest spiritual purpose of this time of conversion:

- Consider joining the Monday evening **book study** and **Eucharistic consecration** "33 Days to Glory".
- Carve some time out to **pray**: join us for daily Mass or for weekly Eucharistic Adoration. Or pray silently. St. Thomas Aquinas Church is open daily at 6:30am.
- Dive deeper into the Word of God by attending one of our **weekly Scripture courses**.
- Look into giving to stock our **Food Pantry** and **Community Closet**. A full listing is provided on page 8.
- Plan to come to the **Stations of the Cross** on Friday.

The Lord Jesus continuously calls us to deeper conversion and discipleship. How will you and I respond?

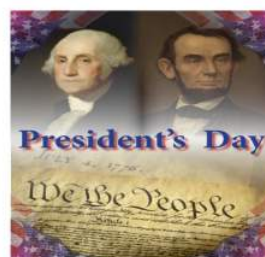
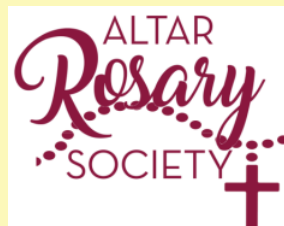

WORD

REFLECTIONS FROM OUR SEMINARIAN

"This is how you are to pray: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name (Matthew 6:9).

In this above passage, Jesus teaches His disciples how to pray. While the Lord's Prayer has been an object of debate among biblical scholars whether it is a pattern of prayer or a prayer in itself, my point of focus shifts a little bit to the starting phrase of this prayer; 'Our Father'. Matthew's account, unlike the Lukan account, begins the Lord's Prayer with a possessive determiner: 'Our'. Theologically, this portrays a sense of Christian brotherhood -family- which forms the theme of our reflection.

In the New Testament, the idea of brotherhood is one that has its foundation in the fatherhood of God. Here, Christians - even from the first century - are united in this common paternity because of their faith and baptism. This fatherhood of God is mediated by Jesus Christ, who is the first Son of God. This means that the brotherliness we possess is founded on our being incorporated in Christ Jesus, in the uniqueness of a new man (cf. Joseph Cardinal Ratzinger, *The Meaning of Christian Brotherhood*, 50). Hence, it is only through Christ and in Christ are we the children of the Father. While this is not only an attempt to reveal the Ratzingerian school of thought on Christian brotherhood, but it is also a passion to bring down to our subconsciousness that we all, by virtue of the sacraments, share in this common fatherhood of God. As such, we are brothers and sister living under the family name of 'Christ the King Parish'.

It is so sad that the days when the Church used to be the center of our daily activities - a home, a place of fun and comfort - are now only memories that the young may not experience. While we can point to so many factors that contributed to this, we must know that the walls of divide are going higher and the culture of individualism persists even in the Church. This obviously questions the credibility and authenticity of our Christian witness which ordinarily should come from a place of mutual love for one another and fraternal commitment. Such Christianity infected by divides and individualism makes us no different from the Priest and Levite who saw the man attacked by robbers on his way to Jericho and walked away (cf. Luke 10:29-37). When we come to Church, but at the same time are beclouded by these barriers that we do not recognize and appreciate this gift of brotherhood/sisterhood evident in the other by the saving grace of Christ, then we are no better than the Pharisees who preached the laws of Moses, but never lifted a finger to practice them.

My dear friends in Christ, as Christians, our task is to be light to the world. One of the ways we can shine our light is by raising the banner of communalism in our society, strengthening the bonds of our brotherhood/sisterhood in the Church, and building a parish community where love and concern for one another is our priority. Our society has seen enough individualism; you can make a change by taking this bold step towards fraternity!



Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations.

In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at: compass.state.pa.us/cwis.

To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. Information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator, Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.
