My dear parishioners:

As we continue our journey on this Second Sunday of Lent, we are invited to reflect on the profound mystery of the Transfiguration of Jesus, which offers us a glimpse of the glory that awaits us as His followers. This vision of divine radiance is not just an event in history; it is an invitation to each of us to be transformed in Christ's light, to be made like Him, and to live as He lived.

In this sacred season of Lent, a time of renewal and transformation, we are reminded of our calling to holiness. The Transfiguration teaches us that we are destined to be like Jesus, not just in the future, but beginning now, as we allow His light to fill our hearts and change us from within. 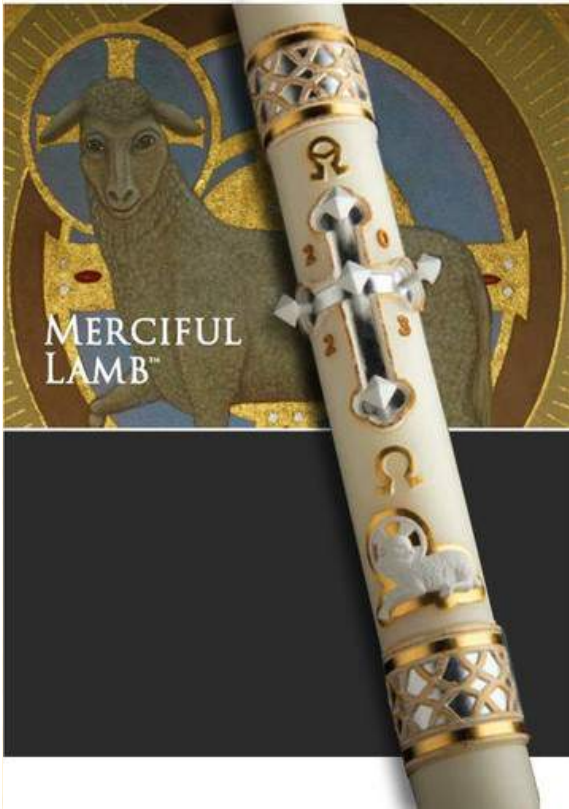
