Pro Life Ministry

On Mother's Day the ProLife Ministry will be collecting donations to support Helpers of God's Precious Infants, NJ.

Helpers NJ is a non-profit 501 c3 corporation of volunteers who enter into the lives of pregnant women and their families in order to ease their life burdens with support services to give them hope.

Mary Anne Barlow and Claire Howson run Helpers NJ which has its foundation in an international crusade begun by Msgr. Phillip Reilly of Brooklyn, NY, in 1989. He recently passed away on November 30th at the age of 90. He was a champion of pregnant women and their unborn children.

Mary Anne meets with moms and together with Claire they assess their needs and advise them on practical steps they can take to move forward.

Helpers relies on private donations and receives no government assistance.

HelpersNJ assists families to move into or stay in their own homes. They also pay motel bills for many in transition. Each client's situation is taken on an individual basis, and each is provided the help they truly need.

Please generously support Helpers NJ who do so much to help moms in need to choose life.

Also, the ProLife ministry will be handing out Memorare Prayer cards & asking all parishioners to pray a daily Memorare to our Blessed Mother; the one who bore the Christ-child; who carried him in her womb; who knows the struggles of motherhood; asking Her to intercede on our behalf for moms in difficult situations, that they receive the help and support they need to choose life.

We also ask our Blessed Mother to intercede for mothers who have lost a child through miscarriage or for any reason, and for women who are struggling with infertility.

May is Mental Health Awareness Month.

What is mental health? Mental health refers to our overall well-being and affects how a person feels, thinks or behaves. It can change as we age and go through life stages. Our mental health can impact our physical health, ability to navigate stress and our interactions with others.

Some signs to be aware for mental health include:

- Changes in mood – this can be affected by weather, people, activities or other circumstances.
- Changes in sleep patterns - sleeping too much, not getting enough sleep or waking frequently from sleep can affect mental health.
- Changes in eating patterns - eating more or less than usual or choosing foods higher in salt, sugar and carbohydrate content with little or no nutrients can have an impact.
- Unusual difficulty concentrating - having to think hard to recall things such as dates, names and what you were doing that is not normal for you.
- Being fearful and constantly worrying about health, finances or other aspects of life.
- Decline in chronic health or mental health issues can be due to stress.

Tips to Support Mental Health:

- Be mindful - Mindfulness of your thoughts, words and behavior is a good indicator of your mental health.
- Track your mood – Make notes on how you feel and when you feel them to help identify patterns of negative emotions and feelings.
- Identify coping strategies – We all cope with emotions differently. Do you stress-eat, smoke, or drink alcohol when you're upset? Do you call a friend, pray or go for a walk when you feel down? Think about how your coping strategies work for you.
- Maintain regular exercise, eat healthy, balanced meals and get adequate sleep.
- Make one small change at a time – taking on too much can be overwhelming.

If you are reading this and find that you are frequently more irritable or exhibiting signs of stress or poor mental health, consider contacting a health provider for guidance and reach out to a trusted family member or friend.

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

World Day of Prayer for Vocations, and Mother's Day.

There has been a lot of media chatter these days about our country's enemies and their threats to our country's defenses. We are the envy of many other people who share this earth with us.

More important for us as believers in Christ is the defensive position we must take to preserve religious freedom. That comes about by our steadfast fidelity to the Creed we pray at every Sunday Mass dating back to the Council of Nicaea in 325 A.D.

But long before that Council, St. Paul, our greatest missionary, made it abundantly clear to his audiences that Jesus Christ is our surest defense against the main enemy of our souls: Satan the father of lies.

In the present secular culture that dominates our country, where the mere mention of the word "God" makes a lot of people uncomfortable, we need to have a more robust Christian faith. I daresay it was easier some n fifty or so years ago. (I took comfort recently when I saw some television news personnel proudly wearing their forehead crosses on Ash Wednesday evening. A tiny breakthrough.)

These thoughts prompt me to remind you of one of best "tools" for a muscular maintenance of our faith life, namely the Sacrament of Reconciliation, or Penance. There is nothing like the feeling of relief one gets after a good sacramental confession.

On two other matters, the first is that today our Church marks the "World Day of Prayer for Vocations. Specifically, we're asked to pray for young men and women to consider either a vocation to the permanent diaconate, or the priesthood or the consecrated life as the case may be. Prayer is a major component, but so is your encouragement to a young man or woman who mentions their attraction to one or the other. You're helping the Holy Spirit do His work!

The second mater also on our minds today is our country's "Mother's Day." We honor that very special person in our lives. Allow me to close these reflections with the tribute of an imperfect but still very great man to his mother:

"My mother was the most beautiful woman I ever saw. All I am I owe to my mother. I attribute all my success in life to the moral, intellectual and physical education I received from her." – George Washington

Sacraments and Policies

Baptism

Held on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month following the 11:30 Mass. Godparents must obtain a Letter of Eligibility from their home parish(es). A one-hour Baptism class is required if the baptism is for the parents' first child. Both parents must attend, and Godparents are strongly urged to attend. Class is held at the Rectory at 7:00pm on the 1st Wednesday of the month. Parents must call the parish office to confirm their attendance at the class.

Marriage

Arrangements must be made 1 year prior to the marriage date. Please contact the Rectory.

RCIA

The process of prayer, study, and spiritual formation that prepares adults for entrance into our faith. Please contact Deacon Kevin Heil.

Parish Membership

Registering in our faith community is the best way to become involved in our parish! When you register, you become part of our vibrant Catholic community whose members support one another in living out Jesus' Great Commission to be his evangelizing disciples. Visit or call the office to register.

Certificates of Eligibility

In order to receive a certificate, you (not your parent) must be a practicing Catholic, and registered in the parish. If married, you must be married in the church. You must attend Mass regularly. Use of weekly offering envelopes will tell us you are attending regularly.

Care of the Sick

Contact the parish office to arrange home visits with the Eucharist for the sick and elderly. Also, contact the parish office for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

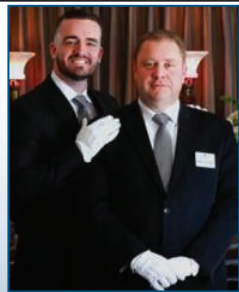
