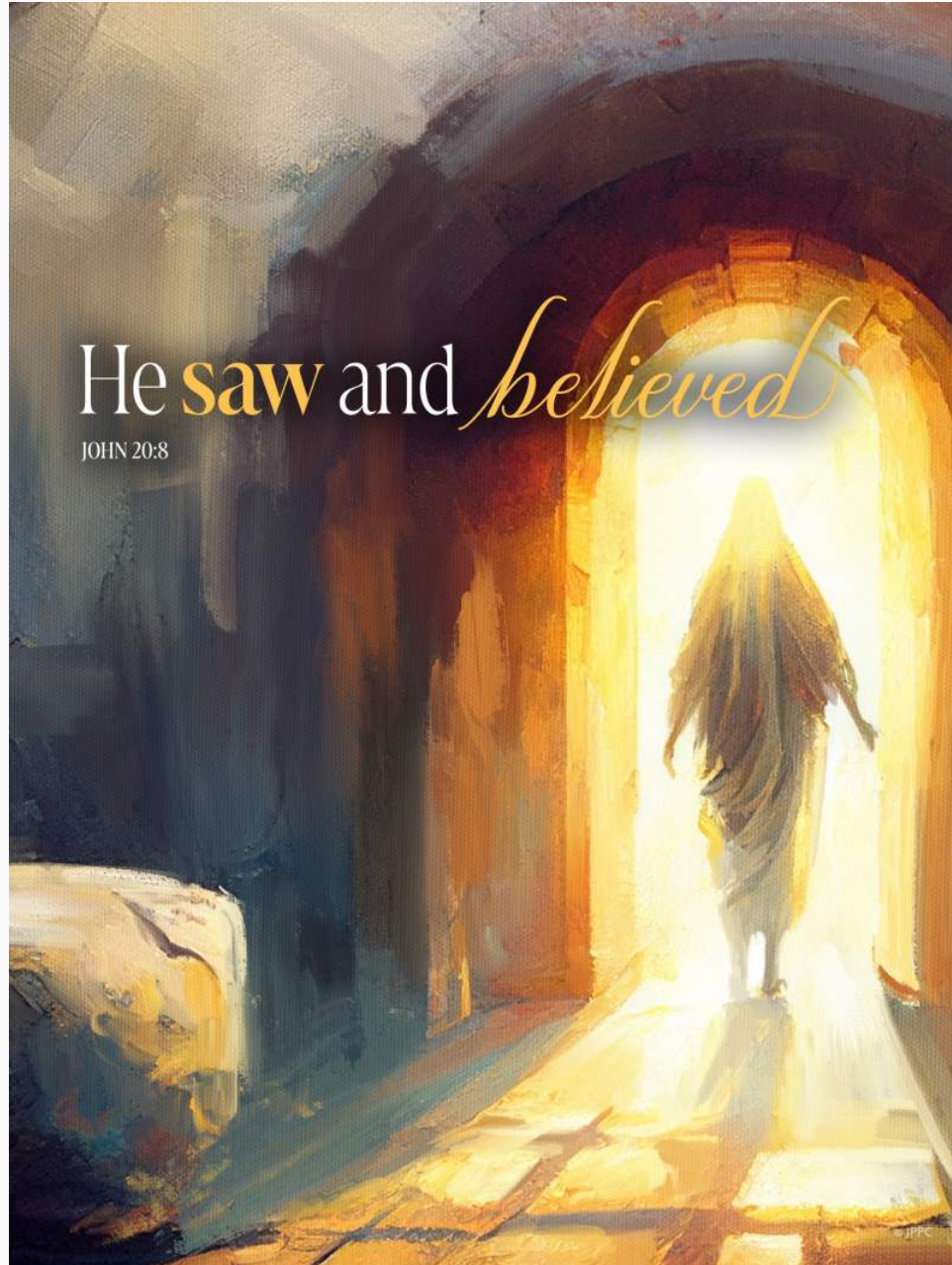

Seven Sisters Apostolate

The Seven Sisters Apostolate is a call to strengthen the Church by ensuring that a Holy Hour is prayed each day of the week for the sole intention of a specific priest—a "holy wasting" or lavishing of prayer for his deeper conformity to Christ. A group begins when at least seven women respond to this mission. Each woman commits to a Holy Hour on a distinct day of the week—prayed at any time on her assigned day, ideally before the Blessed Sacrament. The commitment is one hour per week for one year and may continue as discerned. The Heart of Saint Mary's: Our Good Samaritan Fund!

Our Good Samaritan Fund powers every act of kindness in our parish. We once partnered with the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul, but to maximize impact, we've taken the reins ourselves—ensuring more help reaches those who need it.

We distribute ShopRite gift cards for Thanksgiving feasts, Christmas cheer, and Easter celebrations to Gloucester City residents in need. Plus, we lend a hand with groceries and utility bills (water, electric, gas, or fuel oil) for our Gloucester City neighbors facing tough times.

Emergency After-Hours Priest Access

Recently a parishioner shared that they had difficulty reaching a priest after normal Rectory office hours when a family member was actively dying. We listened and have added a dedicated emergency option to the main Rectory phone number.

If you need a priest urgently for Anointing of the Sick outside regular hours, call the main number and select the emergency option. Leave a brief voice message describing the situation. Our priests will be notified and will respond as quickly as possible.

We apologize for any past difficulty and are grateful for the feedback that helped us improve this important service.

A Liturgical Change

Here at St. Mary's, starting the 1st Sunday of Lent, there will be kneelers in the center aisles in order that one may more easily receive the Eucharist kneeling, if they wish. Our Catholic faith teaches one may receive Communion on the tongue or may receive in one's hands. One may receive Jesus in the Eucharist either standing or kneeling. We want to make sure that you are informed about this change and be assured that one will always be able to receive the Holy Eucharist in any acceptable way. No one will be compelled to receive in any particular way. We believe by making this choice available, it helps to promote greater reverence and dignity at Mass and provide a more inclusive opportunity for people to receive our Lord in a manner that suits their spirituality.

Saint Mary's Lunch Program: Feeding Body and Soul

Every Monday through Friday, from 1:00–2:00 p.m., sandwiches are provided to persons in need who visit the Knights of Columbus Hall at 605 Monmouth Street in Gloucester City.

Our volunteers provide peanut butter and jelly sandwiches, bologna and cheese sandwiches, along with hoagies that are generously donated by Wawa.

In 2024, our parish Lunch Program distributed nearly 5,000 sandwiches, serving close to 3,000 individuals in our community.

Additional volunteers are always welcome! If you can spare just one and a half hours a week to serve the less fortunate among us, we'd love to have you join this vital ministry.

Thanks to the generosity of the Knights of Columbus, we are able to use their hall for this program.

Sacraments and Policies

Baptism

Held on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month following the 11:30 Mass. Godparents must obtain a Letter of Eligibility from their home parish(es). A one-hour Baptism class is required if the baptism is for the parents' first child. Both parents must attend, and Godparents are strongly urged to attend. Class is held at the Rectory at 7:00pm on the 1st Wednesday of the month. Parents must call the parish office to confirm their attendance at the class.

Marriage

Arrangements must be made 1 year prior to the marriage date. Please contact the Rectory.

OCIA

The process of prayer, study, and spiritual formation that prepares adults for entrance into our faith. Please contact

Parish Membership

Registering in our faith community is the best way to become involved in our parish! When you register, you become part of our vibrant Catholic community whose members support one another in living out Jesus' Great Commission to be his evangelizing disciples. Visit or call the office to register.

Certificates of Eligibility

In order to receive a certificate, you (not your parent) must be a practicing Catholic, and registered in the parish. If married, you must be married in the church. You must attend Mass regularly. Use of weekly offering envelopes will tell us you are attending regularly.

Care of the Sick

Contact the parish office to arrange home visits with the Eucharist for the sick and elderly. Also, contact the parish office for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

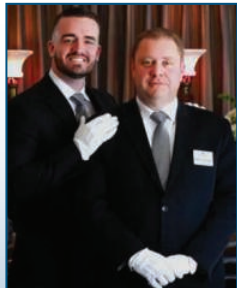
