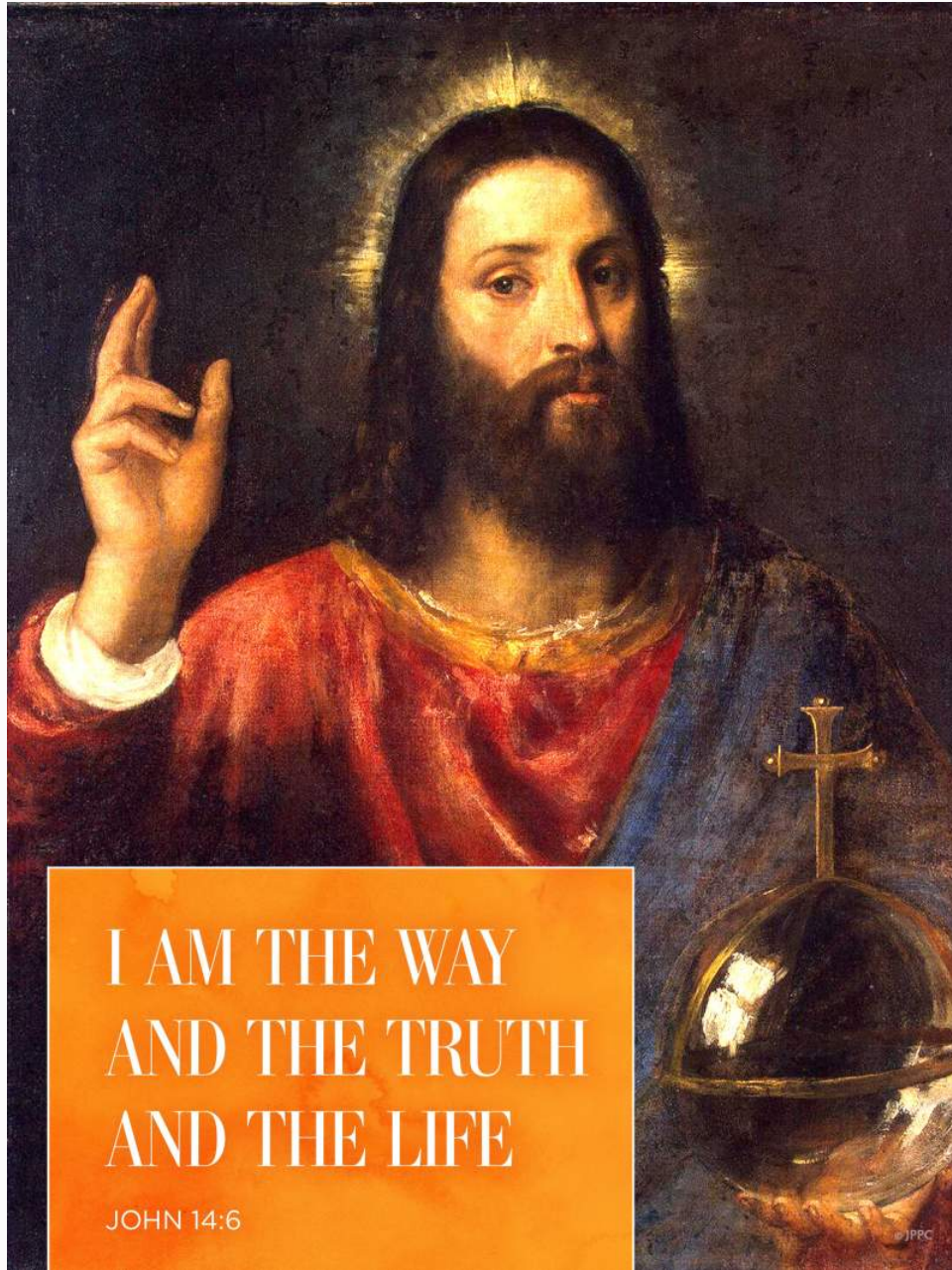

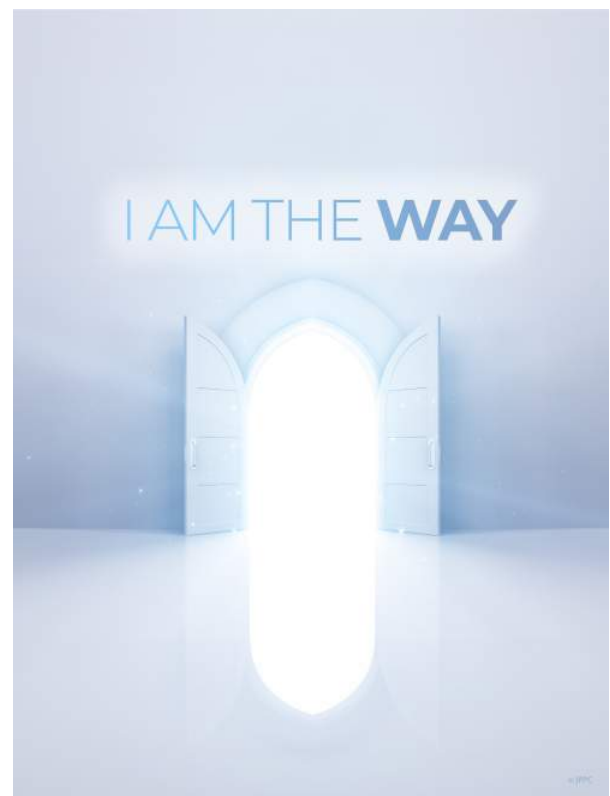

Why Crown Mary?

The Crowning of Mary is a cherished Catholic tradition that honors the Blessed Virgin Mary as Queen of Heaven and Earth. This devotion grew from early Christian belief in Mary's unique role as the mother of Jesus and her closeness to God. Over time—especially in the Middle Ages—artists and theologians began depicting Mary crowned in heaven, reflecting the understanding that because her son is Christ the King, she shares in his glory.

May is traditionally designated as the month of Mary, a time set aside by Christians to honor her in a special way. During this month, many parishes and schools celebrate with a May Crowning, placing a crown of flowers on a statue or image of Mary as a sign of love, reverence, and devotion.

The use of a crown is deeply rooted in Scripture. In Book of Revelation 12, Mary is described symbolically: "A great sign appeared in heaven: a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet and a crown of twelve stars on her head." This image points to her role as queen, the honored mother of Christ the King. The Church reflects on this truth in the Fifth Glorious Mystery of the Rosary, "The Coronation (Crowning) of Mary, Queen of Heaven and Earth."

The tradition was further affirmed in 1954 when Pope Pius XII established the feast of the Queenship of Mary. Today, crowning ceremonies remain a simple yet meaningful way for the faithful to express their devotion, honoring Mary as a loving mother and a model of faith and humility.

National Eucharistic Pilgrimage 2026: One Nation Under God

This summer, the Church in the United States will once again take to the roads with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. The 2026 National Eucharistic Pilgrimage (May 24 – July 5) will journey along the East Coast on the St. Frances Xavier Cabrini Route, honoring America's 250th anniversary with the powerful theme "One Nation Under God."

Starting in St. Augustine, Florida (near the site of the first Mass in what is now the U.S.) over Memorial Day weekend, the pilgrimage will travel northward through many of the original 13 colonies, stopping in historic Catholic sites and cities before concluding in Philadelphia over the July 4th weekend. Nine dedicated perpetual pilgrims, accompanied by chaplains, will carry the Eucharist on foot and by van, inviting the faithful to encounter Christ in public processions, Masses, Holy Hours, and moments of prayer and witness.

As the oldest parish in the diocese, Saint Mary's Church is honored to be the first stop in the Diocese of Camden!

Join us for Mass at 7:00pm on Friday, June 12, which will be followed by the Eucharistic Procession at 7:45pm.

This is a wonderful opportunity for our parish and the surrounding community to welcome Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament and participate in this historic pilgrimage.

Sacraments and Policies

Baptism

Held on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month following the 11:30 Mass. Godparents must obtain a Letter of Eligibility from their home parish(es). A one-hour Baptism class is required if the baptism is for the parents' first child. Both parents must attend, and Godparents are strongly urged to attend. Class is held at the Rectory at 7:00pm on the 1st Wednesday of the month. Parents must call the parish office to confirm their attendance at the class.

Marriage

Arrangements must be made 1 year prior to the marriage date. Please contact the Rectory.

OCIA

The process of prayer, study, and spiritual formation that prepares adults for entrance into our faith. Please contact Deacon Kevin Heil.

Parish Membership

Registering in our faith community is the best way to become involved in our parish! When you register, you become part of our vibrant Catholic community whose members support one another in living out Jesus' Great Commission to be his evangelizing disciples. Visit or call the office to register.

Certificates of Eligibility

In order to receive a certificate, you (not your parent) must be a practicing Catholic, and registered in the parish. If married, you must be married in the church. You must attend Mass regularly. Use of weekly offering envelopes will tell us you are attending regularly.

Care of the Sick

Contact the parish office to arrange home visits with the Eucharist for the sick and elderly. Also, contact the parish office for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

Sexual abuse is a crime that must be reported, investigated and responded to so victims are protected and those who commit abuse are removed from ministry.



A special toll-free number has been established to connect callers to the Diocese's Victim's Assistance Coordinator, to whom allegations of abuse can be made and who, in turn, reports such allegations to the appropriate civil authorities and to the Diocese.

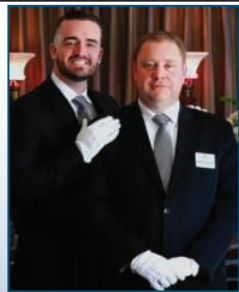
