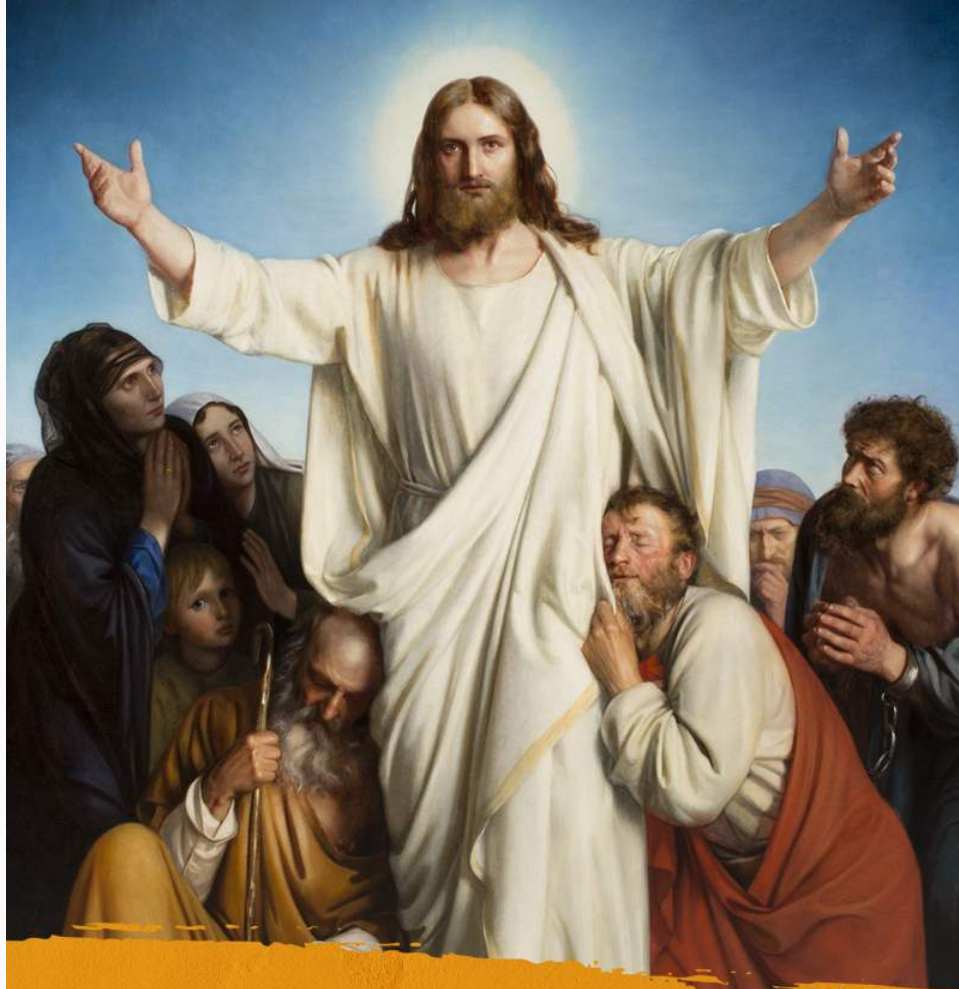

Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity (also known as Trinity Sunday), observed on the first Sunday after Pentecost. This feast invites us to contemplate the central mystery of our Christian faith: one God in three divine Persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

The Mystery of the Trinity

The Trinity is not three gods, but one God in perfect unity and communion. The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are distinct Persons, each fully God, sharing the same divine nature. This mystery was gradually revealed through salvation history and fully manifested in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ, and the sending of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

As the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches, the Trinity is “the source of all the other mysteries of faith” and the origin of the Church’s life. God is an eternal exchange of love, and through baptism we are invited to share in that divine life.

The Trinity invites us to live in loving communion as God does. May we dwell in the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and reflect their love in our families and parish.

It does not take much time viewing Facebook to see the truth that people are fascinated by other people. Whether it is cute toddlers scolding a puppy that is looking right at them, two senior ladies giving advice on living longer, or a middle-aged man revealing details of his model train hobby, we look or laugh or maybe even cry over what has been revealed—but “we’re there.” Maybe for hours on end, or until someone lets us know it is time for supper.

The same holds true for the less electronic fans of biography and autobiographical books. We just want to know as much as we can about as many people as we can. For many, it is an itch that needs scratching. And Facebook editors, booksellers, and movie makers know all about it and do their best to make the stories interesting and even profitable.

So it is no surprise that we humans who believe in a “Higher Power” wish to know as much as we can about the subject—especially if we’re convinced that such a being is a person with intellect and will, and not just a special ape or calf or some force of nature.

When we come to this particular Sunday on the Church calendar that invites us to focus on the Three Persons of the Blessed Trinity, we know automatically that we have entered into “the realm of the unusual,” to say the least.

The fact that we can even conjecture or discuss anything about so holy a matter as the inner nature of God is a tribute to God’s loving nature in the first place. He knows we can never truly understand it. Our minds are too small. Even when we claim to speak authoritatively about the Holy Trinity, using the names of “Father, Son, and Holy Spirit,” we know we are only using the language given to us by God Himself in the Person of His Son, Jesus Christ.

But just as the gift of human friendship grows richer and deeper the more we know and share experiences with our friend, so it is with this friendship and love we share with God. Yet there is a marvelous difference. As St. John so wonderfully phrased it: “It is not that we have loved God as much as that God has first loved us.” He has told us the truth about Himself in order to be loved in return as far as we are able.

There are no secrets between real human friends. So, it should be in our friendship with God. If any secrets do exist, they are ours. That is what God’s “omniscience” reminds us of: He already knows us completely and still loves us.

A group begins when at least seven women respond to this mission. Each woman commits to a Holy Hour on a distinct day of the week—prayed at any time on her assigned day, ideally before the Blessed Sacrament. The commitment is one hour per week for one year and may continue as discerned. Sacraments and Policies

Baptism

Held on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month following the 11:30 Mass. Godparents must obtain a Letter of Eligibility from their home parish(es). A one-hour Baptism class is required if the baptism is for the parents' first child. Both parents must attend, and Godparents are strongly urged to attend. Class is held at the Rectory at 7:00pm on the 1st Wednesday of the month. Parents must call the parish office to confirm their attendance at the class.

Marriage

Arrangements must be made 1 year prior to the marriage date. Please contact the Rectory.

OCIA

The process of prayer, study, and spiritual formation that prepares adults for entrance into our faith. Please contact Deacon Kevin Heil.

Parish Membership

Registering in our faith community is the best way to become involved in our parish! When you register, you become part of our vibrant Catholic community whose members support one another in living out Jesus' Great Commission to be his evangelizing disciples. Visit or call the office to register.

Certificates of Eligibility

In order to receive a certificate, you (not your parent) must be a practicing Catholic, and registered in the parish. If married, you must be married in the church. You must attend Mass regularly. Use of weekly offering envelopes will tell us you are attending regularly.

Care of the Sick

Contact the parish office to arrange home visits with the Eucharist for the sick and elderly. Also, contact the parish office for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

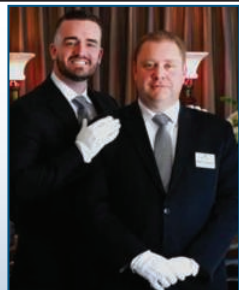
