

Lenten Meditation #3
(Second Sunday in Lent)

LENT AS A LIFE JOURNEY - WHAT IS IMPORTANT?

What is really important to you? If your answer is merely "getting through this day", think about what that means. Life does, indeed, have times of simply needing to survive. God is with us, even in these times, to help us marshal our forces, replacing fear with courage and using the strength we have effectively.

In fact, in primitive times, people spent most of their time hunting or gathering. Survival was central. Yet, as you look at primitive people who are still in our world today, are their lives really less rewarding or more prone to anxiety than our own? There is a lot of worth in the "today-ness" of survival activities. We need to take time amidst our busyness to enjoy our work and our rest, friendship and conversation.

During this Lenten season, however, let's move beyond mere survival. What do we work toward after our basic essentials are met? What values or goals do you consider most important? Suppose that you had all the money you could use and did not need to worry about having enough for any future you might choose. Under such conditions, if some new position were available to you, what values would guide you in deciding whether or not to take it? More prestige, more opportunity for creativity? These are important, but might a new position also be more demanding, robbing you of time to enjoy what you already have? Or more stressful, with resulting tensions either in your family or within yourself? Is it worth it? What is most worth while to you?

Life is complicated. Many values present themselves. How important it is to keep the people-values that faith presents as our top priority! How essential it is to take time for prayer to learn how God might guide us in choosing directions and deciding what is really important!

Early Christianity observed the tradition of anointing the Faithful with olive oil as the 40-day journey of Great Lent was initiated and observed.

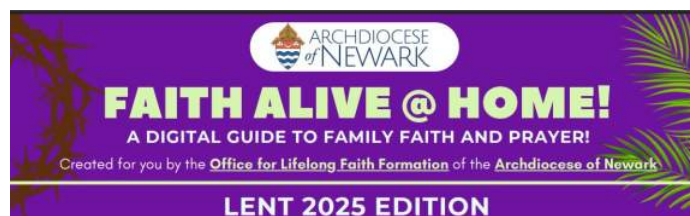

This Lenten Anointing is a “sacramental,” not a “Sacrament.” Lenten Oil is a sign, a symbol, a plea to our merciful God for strength and spiritual support to live out the days of Great Lent in truth and dignity.

May this Blessed Lenten Oil energize, fortify, and strengthen all of us, protecting us from all attacks and temptations of the Evil One. May the example of Our Lord Jesus Christ be our consolation and support. May the presence of God’s Holy Spirit empower us to continue to do good and avoid evil.

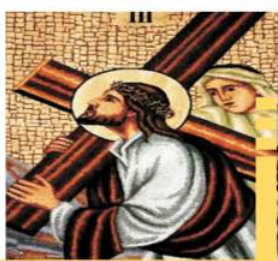

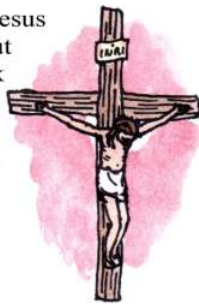
Looking at Jesus
