## Easter Duty

**Easter duty** is the obligation of every Catholic prescribed by the Fourth Lateran Council (1215), which stated that: “Every member of the faithful of either sex who has reached the age of discretion should at least once a year faithfully confess all his sins in secret to his own priest. He should strive as far as possible to fulfill the penance imposed on him, and with reverence receive at least during Easter time the sacrament of the Eucharist.”

It is required by Canon Law that, after having made his or her First Holy Communion, each of the faithful is obligated to receive Holy Communion at least once a year, and this precept must be fulfilled during the Easter season unless it is fulfilled for a just cause at another time during the year.

The dioceses of the United States have an indult that allows the fulfillment of the Easter duty from the First Sunday of Lent (March 9, 2025) through Trinity Sunday (June 15, 2025). Ideally, one should receive in one's own parish, having been properly disposed by making a good confession sometime beforehand to a priest of his or her choice.

## Good Friday

Historically, the Franciscan Friars—the Custodians of the Holy Land Shrines—are acknowledged as the first propagators of the devotion called the *Stations of the Cross*. But, few people are aware of the poignant and touching Good Friday Franciscan Observance, known as the *Deposition* (the taking down) of the lifeless Body of Christ from the Wood of the Cross and His Burial. This emotional and moving ceremony can be rarely witnessed apart from the Church of the Resurrection in Jerusalem and the Commissariat of the Holy Land in Washington, DC.

With profound reverence, this year's Holy Week Celebration at Saint Cassian Church is truly blessed to be able to offer to all our parishioners and friends the religious experience of *THE DEPOSITION* on Good Friday at 3:00 p.m.

Lent was a season during which, not only all amusements and theatrical entertainments were forbidden by the civil law authority, but even the law courts were closed, and this is in order to secure that peace and calm of heart, which is so indispensable for the soul's self-examination, and reconciliation with her offended Maker. As early as the year 380, Gratian and Theodosius enacted that judges should suspend all lawsuits and proceedings during the forty days preceding Easter. The Theodosian Code contains several regulations of this nature; as we find Councils, held in the ninth century, urging the kings of that period to enforce the one we have mentioned, seeing that it had been sanctioned by the canons, and approved by the fathers of the church. These admirable Christian traditions have long since fallen into disuse in the countries of Europe; but they are still kept among the Turks, who, during the days of **RAMADAN**, forbid all law proceedings. What a humiliation for us Christians!

## The Easter Basket: A Family Affair

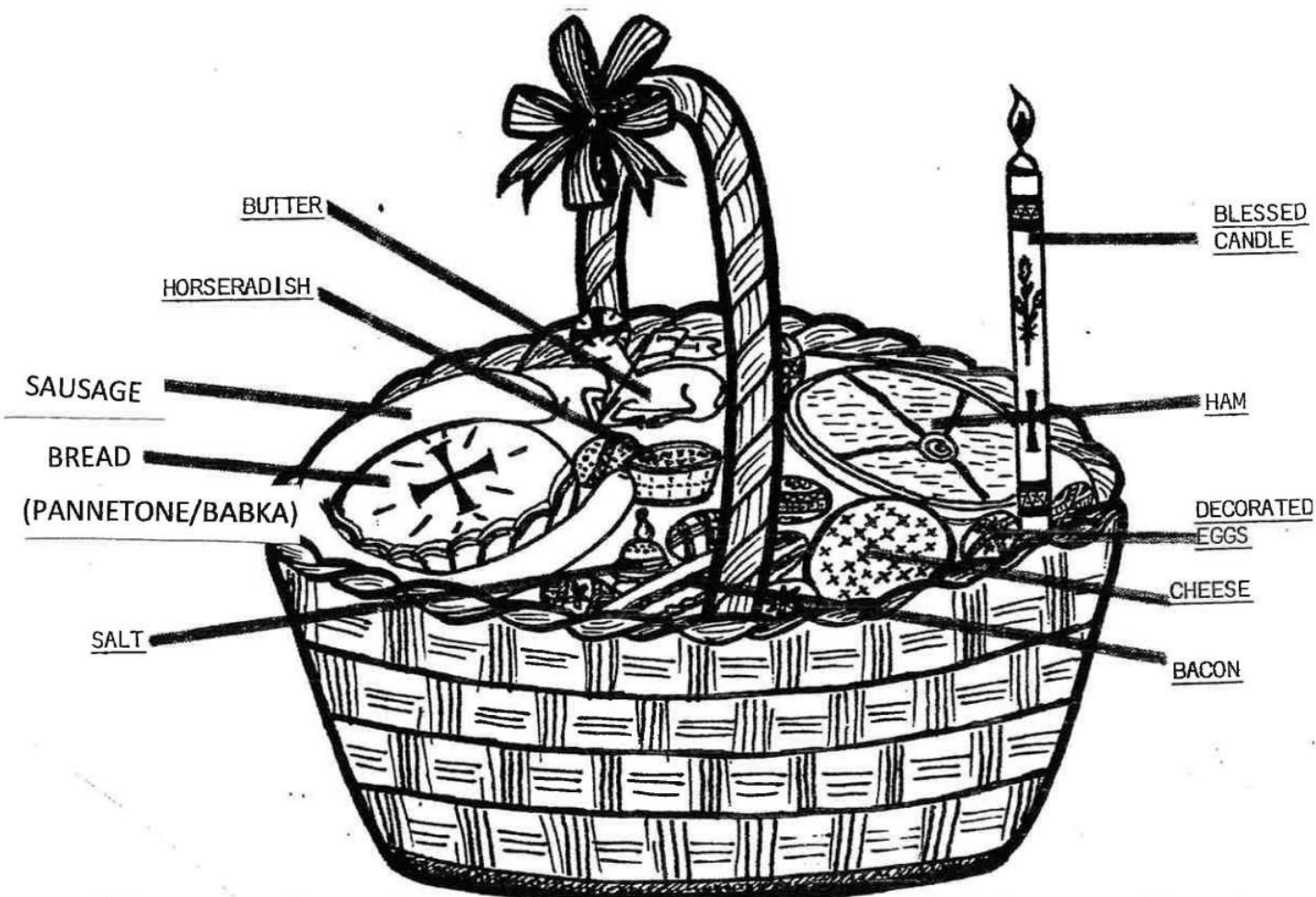
With the approach of the greatest feast of the Church's Liturgical Year—Easter/Pascha—many meaningful customs bring home the message that "Christ is risen!—He is truly risen!"

One of the most powerful traditions is that of the blessing in church of baskets filled with foods that at one time were forbidden to eat during the Great Fast of 40 days, Lent.

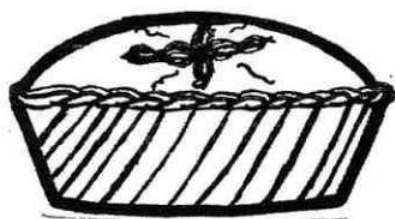
It's hard for us to fathom that at one time the observance of Great Lent was not only a time of intense prayer and generous almsgiving but also a period of strict fasting. No meat, dairy products, eggs, fish, butter, oil, wine, or alcohol during the journey from Ashes to Easter. This was the norm, not the exception.

Devout Christians would nourish themselves on fruits, legumes, and vegetables. This extreme fasting made them weak. With the arrival of the Great Feast of the Resurrection and the end of the Great Fast, they could return to a diet of regular food and drink. But, the change in diet for some was dramatic and difficult. To help insure that they would be fortified and strengthened by the anticipated Easter meal and filled with great devotion, they would gather together as one family of faith in their spiritual home—the Church. There they invoked God's blessing through the prayers of their local spiritual father—the priest.

You are encouraged to gather in our parish church on **Holy Saturday at 1:00 p.m.** with your children and grandchildren, bringing your **EASTER FOOD-FILLED BASKETS** to thank God for persevering during the 40-day Lenten journey. As a special, spiritual family, we are filled with profound gratitude for everything to Our Loving God, Our Heavenly Father!



## How to Put Together a Traditional Easter Basket



BREAD (PANNETONE/BABKA)

THE EASTER BREAD - A SWEET, YEAST BREAD RICH IN EGGS, BUTTER, RAISINS ETC. SYMBOLIC OF CHRIST HIMSELF WHO IS THE TRUE BREAD OF LIFE. USUALLY A ROUND, HIGH LOAF BAKED WITH A GOLDEN CRUST, SUGAR GLAZED AND DECORATED WITH A SYMBOL REMINDING US OF CHRIST'S VICTORY OVER SIN AND DEATH. A CROSS OF DOUGH (+) IS PLACED ON TOP ENCIRCLED BY A PLAIT GIVING IT A CROWNED EFFECT.



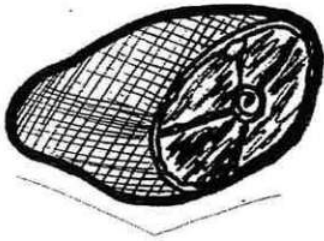
EGGS

HARD-BOILED EGGS BRIGHTLY DECORATED IN FLORAL AND GEOMETRIC DESIGNS MADE WITH MELTED BEESWAX. THEY REMIND US THAT EVEN THOUGH THE SHELL IS DEAD THERE IS HIDDEN FROM OUR EYES THE GREAT LIFE POTENTIAL. SYMBOLIC OF CHRIST THE GIVER OF ALL LIFE ENTOMBED IN THE GRAVE.



BUTTER

A UNIQUE AND FAVORITE DAIRY PRODUCT FOR THE PASCHAL TABLE BECAUSE IT IS MOLDED INTO THE DISTINCT FIGURE OF A LAMB SKILLFULLY DECORATE WITH CLOVES OF PEPPER OF A SIGN OF THE COMPASSIONATE CHRIST. COMPASSION, A VIRTUE TO BE PURSUED BY ALL OF US.



HAM

A VERY POPULAR FLESH MEAT USED AS THE MAIN DISH AT THE EASTER MEAL BECAUSE OF ITS RICHNESS AND SYMBOLIC OF THE OVERPOWERING JOY AND STRENGTH OF THE RESURRECTION. SOME MAY PREFER LAMB OR VEAL. HAM IS USUALLY WELL ROASTED OR BAKED TOGETHER WITH OTHER MEATS SO THAT THE SOLEMNITY OF THE FEAST WILL NOT BE TAXED WITH UNNECESSARY COOKING.



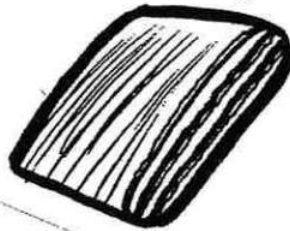
CHEESE

THIS CUSTARD-TYPE CHEESE IS MOLDED INTO A ROUND SHAPE AND HAS A RATHER BLAND BUT MILDLY SWEET TASTE REMINDING ALL CHRISTIANS FOR THE NEED FOR MODERATION. CREAMED CHEESE IS ALSO PLACED IN AN APPROPRIATE DISH AND BOTH CHEESES ARE RESPECTIVELY DECORATED WITH PARSLEY, PEPPERCORNS, OR CLOVES.



HORSERADISH

HORSERADISH MIXED TOGETHER WITH GRATED RED BEETS. A REMINDER TO THE CHRISTIAN OF THE BLOODY PASSION AND DEATH OF JESUS CHRIST; SWEETENED WITH THE PROPER AMOUNT OF SUGAR BECAUSE OF THE VICTORY OF THE RESURRECTION. THE BITTER-SWEET TASTE OF THIS FOOD REMINDS US OF THE UPS AND DOWNS OF LIFE.



BACON

A HEARTY PIECE OF SMOKED BACON CURED WITH EXOTIC SPICES. A SIGN OF THE OVERABUNDANCE OF OUR FATHER'S MERCY TO ALL MEN AND WOMEN.



SALT

A VITAL CONDIMENT FOR SEASONING AND FLAVOR. A REMINDER TO ALL FOLLOWERS OF CHRIST THAT THEY ARE TO SERVE THE NEEDS OF EACH OTHER.




SAUSAGE

A RING OF SPICY, GARLIC SEASONED SAUSAGE OF PORK PRODUCTS, A SIGN OF GOD'S NEVER ENDING GENEROSITY.

PUSSY WILLOWS - THE SIGN OF REBIRTH AND A DECORATED CANDLE ARE PLACED IN THE OVERFLOWING BASKET. THE CANDLE SHOULD BE LIT AT THE TIME OF BLESSING. Lenten Meditation #7  
(Palm Sunday)

LENT AS A LIFE JOURNEY - COMMITMENT

"I'm just afraid to commit myself". --- Many a marriage and many a business contract have been stopped or delayed because of those words. Sometimes this is good. Commitments involve risk. However, without a willingness to commit at times, we miss out on wonderful opportunities and some of the greatest joys life has to offer.

If we are reluctant to make a commitment because of a general fear of uncertainty, then we need to discover what makes us afraid. Are we hesitant because of a lack of self esteem, or is there a substantive reason? We may well be reluctant because of questions as to whether the commitment will return to us what it seems to promise.

Our life journey is at its best when we are willing to accept thoughtful commitments and live up to our intentions. In fact, the journey never goes anywhere until such a choice has been made. One commitment, crucial to all of us, is made to ourselves, to be the best persons we can be. Our major life choices must be made only to those things of genuine worth that will be truly fulfilling.

The example that Jesus sets before us is clear. He refused to commit himself to the devil's wilderness enticements of self-aggrandizement and power. But he did commit himself to fulfill God's calling. Palm Sunday tested that commitment. Beyond the gates of Jerusalem and the crowd's "Hosanna", would come betrayal, trial and death. Only by braving it all could Jesus' mission be fulfilled, so he moved ahead.

Palm branches are ready to be strewn along your path. Are you ready to follow Jesus' steps? Commitment to God's way has its risks, but only by accepting them can we see an Easter Dawn and find fullness of life.



# Palm Sunday *Around the World*

**WALES:** The Welsh celebrate Palm Sunday in a way similar to the American observance of Memorial Day. On Palm Sunday, the Welsh take flowers to the graves of their loved ones. Hence, they refer to this day as Flowering Sunday.

**SPAIN:** Probably nowhere else in the world pays the homage to Holy Week that Spain does. Although many places in Europe have special events for this week, Spain is noted for literally thousands of processions, ranging in location from small villages to the larger cities. In Seville alone, a procession is held every day of the week until Easter.

**SLOVAKIA:** Farmers believe that waving blessed pussy willows over their fields will prevent violent damage to their crops. On Palm Sunday, children search the woods for pussy willows. They collect branches, especially those which have not sprouted, and decorate them with small paper flowers and bright feathers for use on Easter Day.

**GREECE:** With beautiful artistry, the people of Greece weave palm fronds into intricate shapes in honor of Palm Sunday. The shapes include

stars, baskets and crosses. Where palm branches are readily available, churches are decorated both inside and out. In northern provinces, myrtle and bay are substituted for palms. Each family keeps these symbolic woven pieces of art as reminders in the frame of one of the house's religious paintings.

**POLAND:** The palms used in Poland on Palm Sunday are really pussy willows. They are put in water so that they will bloom by Easter Sunday, which is called Flowering Sunday. Here, as is true in many European countries, the people believe in the curative power of flowers related to Easter. Many Poles believe that swallowing a catkin from a pussy willow will protect against a sore throat.

**MEXICO:** Called *Domingo de las Palmas*, Palm Sunday is a great occasion for the people of Mexico, who carry large bouquets of flowers, palms and laurel to church and then on to their homes. Many Mexicans believe that if the flowers are kept throughout the years, they will help protect against illness.
