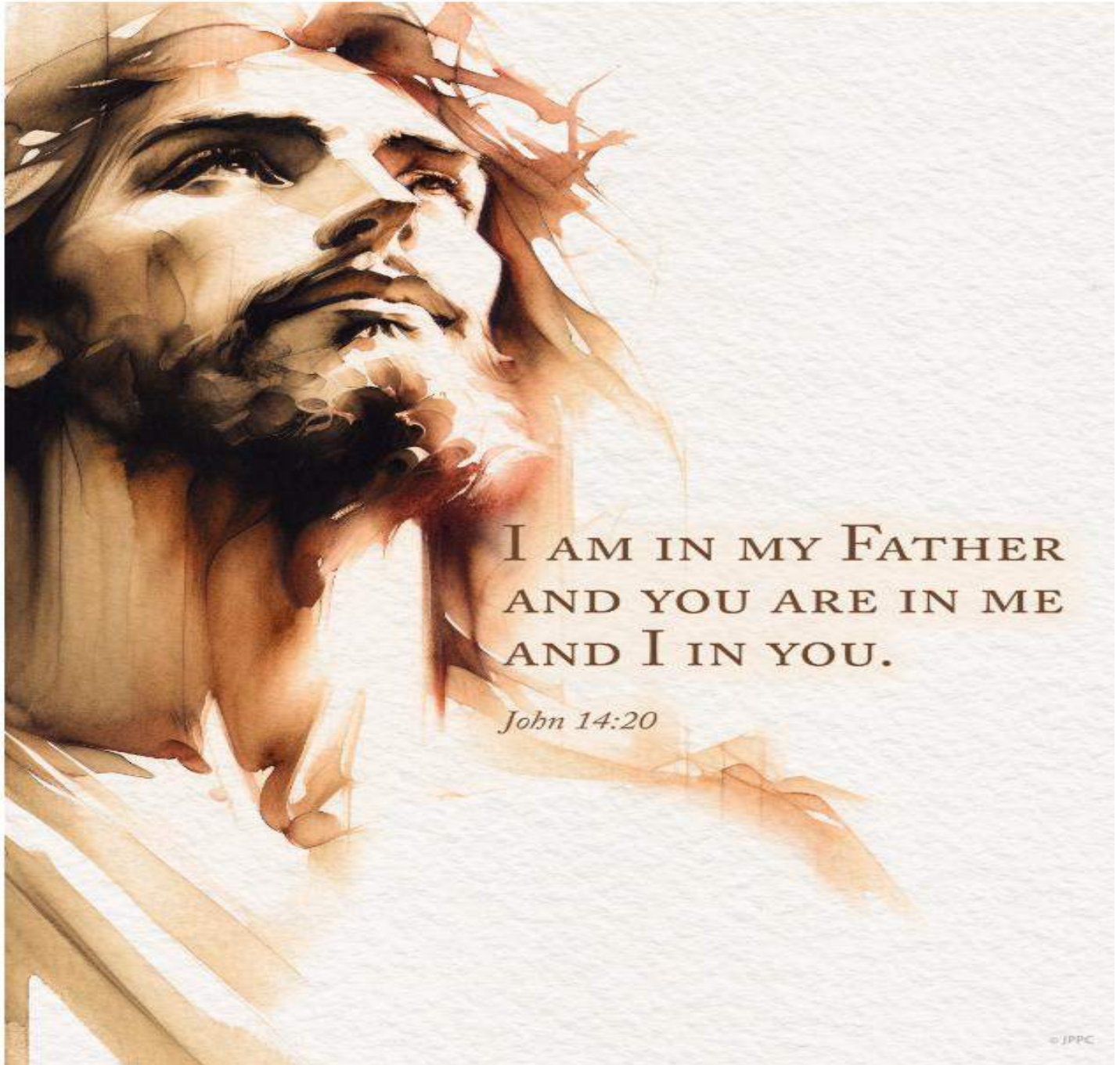

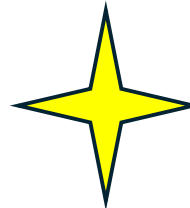

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Humility is a necessary virtue. It is the foundation in which a life a faith and following God is built upon. When we're humble, we're able to love God and others more. But many people have the wrong idea about what humility is.

They think it means putting yourself down. It is not. In fact, when you put yourself down, you're insulting God, because he made you in his own image. You're also harming yourself, which is also insulting to God because loves you. Humility is truth. It means recognizing that the gifts you have are from God, not anything you did, and that they are intended for His greater glory. But we can't be humble on our own, we must ask God for humility. In doing so we follow God's way and become the person that He intended us to be. A life of true humility involves prayer, attitude and actions.

Prayer

1. Petition God for humility in prayer
2. Pray the Litany of Humility and reflect on its petitions
3. Repeat the saying, "It's all about Jesus" as much as possible
4. Meditate on Bible passages about humility (Luke 1:46-55; John 15:5; Philippians 2:5-11; Psalm 131; Genesis 3:19)

Attitude

5. Give God credit for everything good you have and do
6. When given praise, imitate a window in sunlight- reflect it back to God who is the source of all good.
7. Accept you are a sinner, that you are not perfect/faulted but that God loves you anyway

Actions

8. Be obedient – do what is requested of you, unless it goes against your conscience
9. Do everything with the intention: "For the greater glory of God"
10. Examine your conscience every day recognizing your faults with a desire to overcome them.
11. Receive the Sacrament of Confession regularly, understanding you are receiving God's love and mercy.
12. Be a servant not a king - deliberately do grunt work, mundane tasks, and chores that you would normally ask of others
